## Range Safety Report - Larry Parker, Sr. -

We encourage members to seek out our RSO's and have them assist you whenever needed. If an RSO is not able to answer your question they'll do their best to direct you to someone who can.

Volunteer Range Safety Officers will be out on the range Saturday and Sunday from mid morning through early afternoon.

If you would like help with a new firearm or even an old firearm's performance, contact the Club (gm@ccfandg. org or 352-8563) to arrange a time when an RSO will be on the range so you can review the item with them.

If you would like to become a Range Safety Officer, contact Chief Range Safety Officer Jack Commerford, selfdefense@ccfandg.org to find out when the next RSO Class is scheduled. The plan is to hold an RSO Class at least once a year.

Remember, place your targets high enough on the ranges, especially the 100 yard Rifle Range, so that your bullets hit the impact berm--NOT the ground. We're looking at changing the berm system to prevent the possibility of projectiles escaping this range.

Thank you all for your efforts at making our facility a fun and safe place to shoot.

The 3-D targets have been out on the course for some time now. There are 31 targets at varying distances. We ask that if you use the range that you help with target maintenance fees by putting a couple of bucks in the box in the pavilion so that we can keep upgrading our targets and equipment.

We hope to start getting a few new targets in the future for everyone to enjoy. We can only do that with the help from all of the members who use the range.

We have already had a couple of NH Bowmen shoots. In upcoming events, we have the NH Bowmen State Outdoor Field Championship August 15th & 16th at CCF&G. This shoot consists of a 28 target field round and a 28 target hunter round. You may shoot one or both days and we will take your bests scores from each. You must be a current NFAA member to qualify for state champion awards, but guests are always welcome.

If you have never shot field archery before it is a mix of marked distance from 20 feet to 80 yards at varying size targets. The shoot-



er shoots four arrows per target for a possible total score of 560 points. This is excellent practice for both consistent shooting practice and judging distances in the field.

We gather at the range for practice Tuesday evenings (weather permitting). Although most of us use the practice butts in the parking lot, sometimes we will walk the course and shoot for score.

Whether you're a seasoned archer or beginner needing some help, or a seasoned archer that needs some help there is someone to shoot with and offer advice if you would like.

As we get closer to fall and hunting seasons please be reminded that Broadheads are NOT ALLOWED on any of the ranges as these cause serious risk when we are repairing targets. Additionally the material we use will not allow you to remove your broadhead from the target! We hope to have a target specifically for broadheads made soon.
