Coming to the "600" this season

The 600 yard range opened late last fall. Thanks to Neil Jeneral and his cadre of dedicated volunteers, the first 600 yard match was fired on the new range November 2nd.

Ron Coburn fired his salute cannon (a photo is in the display case in the club house) and we played the National Anthem to officially open the range.

With the temperature at 20 degrees and the wind speed about the same, seventeen competitors still couldn't resist the inaugural Sniper match. The match results are posted on the web site.

The range is not quite finished, however all the major components are in place and operational.

The final items, like locating range flags and setting target number boards, will be completed as soon as winter lets go. Refinements will be on going and the CCF&G Club 600 yard range will

become a first class facility.

I hope the "600" generates a lot of interest among the membership. If you are not yet a competitive shooter you are still welcome to use the range on scheduled practice days.

Since safety is paramount, there will be some basic requirements for all who want to shoot "600"

You will need a center fire rifle chambered for a cartridge capable of reaching 600 yards safely, have at least a 200 yard zero, and known values for sight adjustments. Then, an experienced shooter can help get you on target. A complete list of requirements will be posted on the web site.

Planned CMP National Match Course matches, Vintage Sniper Matches, NRA approved Mid-Range matches, and weekly practice sessions make for an ambitious calendar this season. See the web site for match details.

Mini-Palma at CCF&G

International High Power Rifle competition will be coming to our 600 yard range this summer.

A Mid-Range match on July 12 will be used as the final competition to select the New England "Mini-Palma" team for 2015.

For thirty five years a friendly long range rifle competition between the New England States and the Canadian Maritime Provinces has alternated between countries. This year we travel to Nova Scotia for three days of shooting.

The Canadians have invited us to compete in their "Atlantic Championships" on September 5th & 6th with the "Mini-Palma" Match and banquet on the 7th.

Each team consists of twelve firing members. Eight sling

shooters and four F/FTR shooters make up each squad. Any New England resident is eligible to try out for the US team. The course of fire is determined by the host team.

We will shoot from 300 to 800 meters at a new range just outside of Halifax, NS. For the next few years Larry Racine, Larry Piazza and I are serving as co-captains for the "Yanks."

I plan to have CCF&G Club host the match next year when the Canadians visit us. We have a new "600" to show off. I know they will enjoy shooting here.

Posted on the web site is a document about the "Mini-Palma" Match along with the High Power information.

Range Safety Report

We will be starting up our RSO roster this April, so watch for these folks to be out on the range to help you out.

We encourage members to seek out our RSO's and have them assist members whenever needed. If an RSO is not able to answer your question they will do their best provide direction to someone that can.

Volunteer Range Safety Officers will be out on the range every Saturday and Sunday from mid morning through early afternoon. You may find Dave Swenson or Mark Timney on the range on weekdays.

If you would like help with a new firearm or even an old firearm's performance, contact the Club (gm@ccfandg. org or 352-8563) to arrange a time when an RSO will be on the range so you can review the item with them.

An updated list of RSO's will be in the Club's SOP which is being updated and will be on the web site soon.

If you would like to become a Range Safety Officer, contact Chief Range Safety Officer Jack Commerford, selfdefense@ccfandg.org to find out when the next RSO Class is scheduled. The plan is to hold an RSO Class at least once a year.

Remember, steel targets produce bullet splatter/debris. EYE PROTECTION is to be worn by EVERYONE at that range. Be sure steel targets are at least 30' from the firing line and that they have at least a 5 degree forward angle. When shooting on the 100 yard Rifle Range, your targets must be placed high enough so that your bullets are hitting the impact berm.



Training Report

Attitude and Mindset: Forgotten components of safe shooting

Attitude is probably the most important aspect of safe firearm handling, but one that is often neglected.

No matter how long you've been shooting, accepting that there is always room for learning is an important part to continued improvement. On or off the range, most accidents happen when one gets too confident as it leads to complacency in gun handling.

Getting a tight shot group or being the fastest on the trigger isn't always synonymous with safety, and an unsafe handler is simply not a good shooter. A hint of doubt should be kept; it's called having respect for firearms. It is what makes you double-check yourself and keeps you safe. That goes double for storing, maintaining, and inspecting your gear.

Mindset refers to the frame of mind you have when you pick up your firearm. Whether your purpose is hunting, protection, or competition, replicating the emotional aspects of the situation you are practicing for is far more important to achieving your goal than pulling the trigger repeatedly under perfect conditions.

Many boxers took ballet classes to improve, so don't limit yourself to just one purpose. Recreational Pistol or .22 shoots will help a competitive shooter and a "plinker" too so give them a try!

Great opportunities are available to help you achieve your goals and are hosted by fantastic people. Attitude or mindset—take a refresher class, try something new, participate or even volunteer at one of the activities! Check the calendar, website, or ask at the clubhouse. You will be a better and safer shooter for it!

New Rec. Pistol Practice Night

It's hard to predict how you might perform during a life-threating situation, but perhaps the club's Recreational Pistol events can better prepare you to use a handgun in case of a dire event.

Starting on April 15th, CCF&G will be holding recreational pistol practices each Wednesday from 4:00 – 7:30 p.m. The practices will continue until the end of September. A \$3.00 fee will cover an entire evening of shooting. Whether you're a beginner or veteran shooter, male or female, all are welcome.

Here you will learn to compete in IDPA-like, defense handgun events, and you'll learn techniques that might just save you and your love ones' lives. You will be able to practice a different set-up/stage each night, as well as prepare for the official IDPA Qualifier.

The practices will give you a chance to develop shooting skills without the pressure of competition or shooting "on the clock." You can practice your timing on 'pop-ups,' draw, or shooting on the move as many times as you please.

"We want to make it easier for people to get involved in this type of action shooting," said Mark Timney, a CCF&G member, who will be running the practices.

Another CCF&G member and Recreational Pistol Practice coordinator, Mark Carey, said the practices will help "people develop better gun-handling technique and marksmanship as it allows them to take themselves to the next level."

Regular Rec. Pistol events will be held the second Saturday of every month. While these events are formal competitions, they are still "low-key" competitions with the goal of making people more comfortable with their handgun than finding out who's the best shot.

Recreational Pistol events will take place on May 9, June 6, July 11, August 8, September 12 and October 10 this year.


