We sent over 1000 letters to current and past members in October to get our fundraising drive in motion. It certainly has been a slow start.

Office hours are Mon, Wed & Fri 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.



Indoor Archery 2017

North Branch Bowmen is now shooting at the Keene Recreation center on Washington St. every Tuesday night through March following our very full youth archery program.

With open shooting from 7-9:00 p.m. we have plenty of room for everyone. We also shoot on Sundays from noon to 4:00 p.m. with the exception of a few weekends when we have scheduled tournaments. On the tournament Sundays open shooting will be from from 3-4:00 p.m. Our tournament dates are 1/1/17, 3/5/17 & 3/25-26/17

A little about our tournaments....North Branch Bowmen is affiliated with NH Bowmen, the state organization which hosts the State Championship and the NH Bowmen Grand Slam. The tournaments are friendly competition which match age divisions and styles of archery to compete against fellow archers.

We begin the season competing on the Vegas-style targets at a distance of 20 yards, as some NH archers will travel to Lancaster PA for the popular eastern Lancaster shoot in January and some will travel out to Las Vegas for a shoot with well over 2000 archers from around the world. The Vegas target has multi colored rings with a quarter size 10 ring.

As we get into February we will be shooting at the NFAA (National Field


Archery Association) blue and white targets. This will prepare us for our State indoor Championship to be held at Pioneer Sportsmens.

After the state championship we will begin practicing for our 25 meter shoot, our last leg of the NH Bowmen Grand Slam to be hosted by North Branch Bowmen in March. The target is similar to the Vegas target, only much larger. Tournament fees are \$10 adults \$5 youth and \$20 adult \$10 youth for the Grand Slam events.

All are welcome at our tournaments. You only need to be a NH Bowmen member to compete in the grand slam event, and if you compete in the state championship and want to shoot for state championship title you must be an NFAA member. Otherwise, you would shoot as a guest.

The North Branch Bowmen Bow raffle to benefit CCSSEF;s indoor range project is going strong. Pete's Archery was generous enough to donate a bow to be raffled off. We have a Mathews Z2, right hand, 70lb, 28" draw length. Only 250 tickets will be sold at \$10 per ticket donation. Finally if you have never tried archery, or you tried it when you were a kid and wanted to give it another chance, why not come up to the Rec. Center? Certified instructors are available to help guide

- Action Pistol News -

What type 'steel' should we shoot?

It looks like Action Pistol will be able to expand into Steel Challenge-type matches in 2017. I've been told the targets will be bought and the new pistol ranges will be finished in time for us to hold a few events.

The question, at least in my mind, is do we want to be "official' about it or go our own way? You can find a description of Steel Challenge here: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Steel Challenge.

We could follow these rules, or even become a USPSA club and hold sanctioned matches. But we could also slightly modify the event, much as we do with our IDPAlike matches, to make them a little more shooter friendly and less expensive.

In particular, I'm thinking we might only shoot four strings of fire instead of five per stage. This would save each shooter at least 20 rounds of ammo. (You'll still need a minimum of 100 rounds to shoot the match, with most shooters probably firing 125+ rounds.)

We might also modify a stage or two to mimic a self-defense scenario. For example, there might only be three targets to shoot instead of five. Here you would double-tap two of the targets before you hit the 'stop plate' with a single shot.

Let me know what you think. The warm weather is going to be here sooner than you think.

By the way, Action Pistol is all about about helping individuals develop familiarity and competency with their handguns during simulated self-defense scenarios. Our practices and events are more for learning than they are for competition.

Winter .22 pistol and rifle shoots are here!

The shoots are scheduled as follows: Feb 5 – Rifle, Feb – 19 Pistol, March 5 – Rifle, March 19 – Pistol, April 2 – Rifle, and April 16 – Pistol.

Cost is \$10 per session. These shoots have traditionally been run with a timer and plate racks. You have a specified amount of time and shots to drop the plates. Your score is how many you down in the alloted time. We do multiple runs for each event, so if you have a bad string of fire it won't drop you out of the running.

Any type of semiautomatic .22 rifle or pistol can be used. You'd be at a disadvantage with a bolt action rifle, but it can be done. Ruger 10/22 rifles are very popular, as are Ruger mIII pistols. It's good to have at least four magazines, but more is better.



Long Range Prone for 2017

Hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and a happy New Year. Winter has finally settled in and it's time to fire up the reloading bench. I have some new bullet and powder combinations to try this spring, and I'm screwing a new Krieger barrel on my #1 Palma rifle.

I have the dates scheduled for the prone matches this year and they are posted on the calendar. There are fewer matches here this year and I tried to coordinate with the other active 600 yard ranges so we don't step on each other's toes. Hopefully we will all have better attendance.

Like last year, I plan on being available most Saturday mornings from 10:00 a.m. till noon to get you sighted in to shoot at the 600 yard range. Several members qualified last summer and are having a blast at the Thursday practices. A few have tried their luck at the matches and have done remarkably well. If you shoot two NRA approved matches (120 rounds for record), you will receive a Mid-Range Classification Card which allows you to compete at your skill level.

A 600 yard clinic is also planned this summer (date to be announced). This will be geared to the shooter who wants to progress from just having fun on Thursday. We will discuss equipment, ammo, position, wind, shooting strategy and then put it to practice on the line.

I'll try to have several experienced competitors to help out. A small range fee may be required, but this will have to be determined at a later date.

The dates for all of the other high power rifle events are also posted. Check out these matches, 200 yard offhand, vintage sniper rifle, service rifle clinic, NH league, and CMP EIC Leg. There is something for everyone. Contact the event organizers for details.


