By now you've heard about a home near our facility being struck by a bullet. Fortunately, no one was hurt and the homeowner isn't holding the organization responsible.

lucky here, but we can't depend upon luck when it comes to firearm safety. That's why we've closed the rifle ranges and have scheduled safety classes for the membership. (See article on this pages 1 and 2 for more information.)

Please understand that we will not reopen the rifle ranges until these improvements are made, and members will not be allowed to use the rifle ranges until they've been recertified.

This club has had an excellent safety record. We want it to stay that way, and we want to be good neighbors to those around us. To do this, we need your help.

If you ever see anyone doing something which you think isn't safe or is against range procedures, politely ask them to reconsider their actions. If the individual is less than cooperative, contact a Range Safety Officer or mention the incident to myself or Larry Parker.

I'm not asking you to police others at the range. I'm only asking that you remind other members about the importance of safety. Our continued enjoyment of shooting sports depends upon all of us behaving responsibly at all times.

The cost for the project will set the club back about \$40,000. This is money that I'd rather see spent on our indoor range project, but safety is a priceless commodity. Please do still consider donating money toward the project. We need you now more than ever before.



Safety Classes Planned Pistol Bays Still Open

- From the CCSSEF Board of Directors -

CCSSEF's 100 and 200-yard ranges will be closed for about two months for a range improvement project. As part of this project, all members will be required to receive instruction on range safety operations before they use either range once they reopen. Pistol Bays one, two and three, are still open and can be used by any member during normal operating hours.

"We're doing this voluntarily in response to a bullet recently striking a home about a half mile away from our facility," said Larry Parker, Sr., CCSSEF's General Manager. "Safety has always been, and will always be, our number one concern."

The project, which was approved unanimously by CCSSEF's Board of Directors on March 1, will alter the berms on the 100 and 200-yard ranges. Additionally, the 100-yard range will see the installation of a berm at fifty yards, and the range will be limited to rimfire rifles in the future. (See the GM's Message for more information on the range projects.)

"This project will make it even more difficult for a bullet or a ricochet to ever leave a range in the first place," said CCSSEF's Board Chair Mike Hagen.

Sometime near the end of April, each CCSSEF member will be required to take a safety training class or seek out individual training with one of the club's certified Range Safety Officers. The instruction will introduce members to new range operating procedures. Details and dates for the classes will be available on the website.

"We hope to get the ranges open again by the end of April. We've had an excellent safety record, and we will do everything we can to be a good neighbor to those around us and to make all of us safer shooters."

GM's Report

The rifle ranges are closed for open shooting, but scheduled events on these two ranges will continue under supervision as planned.



All pistol bays are open for pistol and 22 rimfire rifle shooting. We appreciate our member's understanding of the need to ensure we are operating safely.

The improvements to the rifle ranges will be both physical and procedural. On the open 50/100 yard range, the road to the 200 yard pits will move from the right on the concrete pad (with benches) to the left of the pad. The right end of the pad will be built up with additional benches, and the area will see a permanent cover built over it.

The current ten point, 100 yard covered rifle range will be for .22 rimfire, with a new short berm added at 50 meters. On both ranges, the 100 backstop berms will be dressed up.

Additionally, ALL target placements on the rifle ranges will be at the berms. The use of portable target frames/targets at any other distances or locations will NOT BE ALLOWED.

All fired projectiles must go directly into a backstop after engaging their target. Individual range "total bullet containment" is our goal at keeping the range safe. Once the rifle ranges are completed, we will be reviewing our pistol ranges to ensure all bullets are contained. Target placement is the solution to this.

We hope to start the mandatory Re-Orientation sessions in late April. The plan is to have evening sessions for 2 weeks and Saturday morning sessions. The re-orientation will be done by our volunteer Range Safety Officers. There is a Range Safety Officer meeting on Saturday April 8th at 2pm to review these new procedures. We will also be scheduling a target base/frame work party for some time in April.

The 2017 NRA Sectional matches have concluded. 2016 Junior Sectional results are still available. Our Team ranked 11th Nationally in 4 Position Conventional.

Carbines, shotguns and classes

Action Pistol will add pistol caliber carbines to the mix this year, as well as shotgun and revolver-specific events, a new type of steel match, and introductory classes for people who want to try action shooting.

Pistol caliber carbines (PCC) will have their own class at our usual matches. Competitors can still shoot their regular pistol class if they like and throw in an extra \$10 to shoot PCC too. Calibers will be limited to 9mm, .40 and .45acp.

Competitors should have at least two large capacity magazines (20+), a magazine pouch, chamber flag, and a sling or a soft case for transporting the carbine when not on the firing line.

The shotgun and revolver-specific matches may be held in lieu of regular Action Pistol events or scheduled on separate days, depending upon overall interest. If the events are held during regular Action Pistol matches, competitors who want to shoot semi-auto pistols will still be allowed to participate.

The steel matches are an attempt to combine IDPA-type shoots with Steel Challenge shooting. For lack of a better name, we're going with Tactical Steel. Initial plans are for three strings of fire on each of six different stages, making it similar to Steel Challenge in that we'll throw



out the time for the slowest string.

The scenarios and target placement, however, will be more akin to IDPA. For example, you might have to hit five steel poppers while moving or engage two steel plates with two shots each from behind a barrel before hitting the (final) 'stop' plate with a single round.

Tactical Steel matches will allow for .22 rimfire rifles and pistols, and for pistol caliber carbines. Those using .22s or PCCs will begin each string from a low-ready position. All other pistol classes, however, will draw from a holster.

PCC and .22 rifle/pistol classes will have iron sight and optics divisions. Centerfire pistol classes will include 'stock' (limited to production gear only), 'limited' (no optics/ compensators/race holsters) and 'open' (no equipment limitations).

Competitors will ideally have three magazines or a few very large (20+) capacity magazines. If you use a long gun and don't have a CONTINUED ON PAGE 9




