We are the CHESHIRE COUNTY SHOOTING SPORTS EDUCATION FOUNDA-TION, INC. The change in our legal name from the Cheshire County Fish and Game Club was made in 2010.

One of the concerns that we face at the range is name recognition. The fish and game name was pretty well known but it and the new name are a mouthful. Many years ago, as you can see from the sign on the right hand side of the entrance, we were known as the Ferry Brook Range. Why? You guessed it, the Ferry Brook runs through the property.

Historically, there appear to have been many names including the Keene Rifle Club and affiliation with a YMCA rifle team. At some point, I would really like to entice one of you, our faithful readers, who has a penchant for and interest in historic research, to come up to the office and scour through old documents and relics to put together a time line and to flesh out the events that helped the range evolve to what it is today.

Today, we are multi-disciplined: rifle, long range rifle, pistol, competitive pistol, black powder both modern, old, and replica, cowboy long range, safari rifles (really big bore guns), tactical rifle and pistol, trap and five stand in shotcont's on page 4 gun, and a complete year-round archery program.

# **EVENT NEWS**

#### **2019 Mini-Palma Match** June 2 and 30, 2019 Tryouts and Team Selection

This year's Mini-Palma Match and the Canadian's Atlantic Championship will be held on Prince Edward Island over the Labor Day Weekend. We have been invited to shoot in their championship on August 31st and September 1st. This will be open to all team and nonteam members. The banquet will be held on September 1st and the Mini-Palma Match will be shot on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. We did this in Nova Scotia in 2015 and it worked out great . We got a lot more shooting in and got a handle on the range. For those of you who have not shot in Canada, it's a great experience. You'll need about 150 rounds for the Atlantic Championship and (for a small fee) you may attend the banquet. I'll post more detailed information soon.

There will be two tryouts for the Mini-Palma team this year. I want to get the team selection process over early this year to avoid conflicts with other events. The tryouts will be held in Keene on June  $2^{nd}$  and June  $30^{th}$ . Each tryout will consist of three 20 round 600 yard matches. The team consists of 6 sling/iron sight shooters and 4 F/TR shooters. Permissible calibers are .308 and .223/5.56mm. A bullet weight of no more than 156 grains for .308 sling shooter is required but no required bullet weight for others. These are the Mini-Palma and Canadian rules.

In 2018, we had two tryout matches, I had to find a way to compare them fairly. While we had fair weather both days, the wind conditions were quite different, so using pure scores would be unfair. I decided to assign a numerical value based on your placement in the match. I eliminated the competitors not trying out for the team.

Twenty points were awarded for first place, nineteen points for second, and so on.

However, a competitor might make the team with a higher placement but lower score than someone with a lower placement and higher score from the other match because of the number of competitors in each match. I had to stay with one method i.e. numerical ranking throughout the selection process. This method has been used in the past for our team selection, and while not perfect it works better than most other methods. This is about as fair as I can make it.

Competitors shooting both matches got the benefit of using their highest placement. The

only time a score was employed was when competitors had the same placement. Then the high score prevails.

I will post the results and team selection as soon after the June 30th match as possible. Don't wait to get your passport — do it now. If you don't make the team you can still shoot.

#### 600-Yard High-Power Rifle Wind Reading Clinic July 14, 2019, 9 ам

The High Power rifle season will soon be in full swing. I have been asked several times about putting on another wind reading clinic, so I'm planning a clinic on July 14th. The start time will be 9 am at the club house. Please arrive about a half an hour early to get signed in. I am going to request that you preregister so I know how many handouts and assistants to have available.

Firstly, we will spend about an hour discussing prone shooting. Topics to include: Shooting disciplines, Positions, Equipment, Ammo, Reloading, Wind Reading, and Shooting Strategies. Wind reading and shooting strategies will dominate the discussion. Learning to cope with the wind , which is half science and half art, is the key to successful mid-range and long range shooting. Make the wind your friend.

I am also hoping to have help from a couple of F/TR High Master shooters to discuss and demonstrate F/Class shooting techniques. This should be great high level information for all of the F/Class shooters. We will then put some of these ideas to the test on the firing line.

To attend, you will need the following: A 600yard "zero" for your rifle (elevation and no wind "0") and about 50 rounds of ammo—target quality if possible (69 grain or heavier bullet for .223/5.56), Spotting scope if you have one (I will have a few extras available), Which ever shooting gear you feel comfortable with ( bi-pod, rear bag, shooting mat, etc.) and most importantly lunch. I have a couple of loaner rifles for those without equipment. I can also provide match grade ammo (.308) for \$10.00 per box of 20 rounds.

I will be available for you to get a 600 yard "zero" on Saturdays from 10:00 AM till Noon. Try to attend one of our practices on Thursdays at 9:00 AM till noon or 4:00 pm till finished. The fee for the clinic this year is \$20.00. The cost of printing (the handout booklet is now almost 100 pages) and range supplies is up again. \*Let me know in advance if you need a rifle and ammo. With cooperation from the weather, I think we can have a very productive day. If you want to attend or have any questions, contact me.

#### **Action Pistol**

People own firearms for various reasons. Collecting, hunting, competition and of course self defense. They own rifles, shotguns and pistols. Firearm owners represent all ages, from those introduced in rifle clubs in schools and local clubs to seasoned shooters and everyone in between.

I see all manner of folks at the range, hanging targets anywhere between 10 yards and 600 yards. The sport has something for everyone. From long range high power rifle to defensive handgun to casual target shooting.

What most seem to have in common is that they all have taken time to learn the fundamentals, safety and respect. Whether you like to punch holes in paper at long ranges or plan to carry a firearm, you need to know how to safely handle and respect it.

Ferry Brook Range and other rangess in the area offer a variety of courses designed to teach you the basics of firearm handling be it hunter safety or personal protection. More advanced training is offered to those who want to try their hand at competition. The High-power League and **IDPA** (**International Defensive Pistol Association**) style shooting are just two.

If you plan on carrying a pistol for self defense, you are doing yourself a huge injustice if you think just firing at stationary targets will make you proficient. It will not. Courses like *Personal Protection Inside the Home* will reveal that gun ownership is more than pointing it at a target. There are psychological factors to consider as well as the legal and personal aspects.

Rifle, shotgun or pistol? It doesn't matter. Handling them safely must be second nature. Resolving a malfunction under pressure ( the timer in competition or a real life confrontation ) and total awareness of your surroundings are skills learned only by practice.

CCSSEF has many programs tailored to your interests. For handguns we have the Action Pistol program. Here you are exposed to situations where the targets move! Sometimes they move then hide and sometimes you are also moving. The point is that in real life the 'bad guy' doesn't stand there with a target on their chest.

You will learn the safe way to draw from a holster, reload your firearm while moving and learn how to recognize threats as well as effective use of cover. We do drills designed to develop your muscle memory as well as teach some skills difficult to learn elsewhere.

This program is relaxed and non-competitive and you work at your own pace. It is you against you, not another shooter. You can gauge your progress each week and see the areas you need to work on.

Wednesday night practice consists of warm up targets, sometimes a drill where others share their tips as well as a practice 'stage' where you can get a taste of an actual competition if you wish.
