

North Branch Bowmen hosted the New Hampshire Bowmen state championship on August 7th and 8th. While we didn't have very many archers, our guest shooter was Bill Hall from Connecticut and our New England Field Archery Counselman. Bill shot on Saturday, and I joined him; he has some good ideas and much-needed energy to try and rebuild the low attendance at our outdoor shoots around the country.

I am looking forward to seeing how the New England shoot goes on Labor Day weekend with a new format of half field round and half 600 round. Go to NFAA USA archery http://www.nfaausa.com for rules, shooting formats, and more information.

Now that the leaves are changing color and the days are getting shorter, many of us are thinking about the upcoming archery season. New Hampshire has one of the earliest and longest bow seasons in New England, beginning September 15th and continues through to December 15th (always check the fish and game rules before heading out). That being said, do yourself a favor and dust off and check out your equipment, make sure that your strings and cables are in good shape, your broadheads are razor-sharp, and everything is tight before you go sight in. When practicing, remember to practice with the gear you will have on—a backpack, sweatshirt, light gloves, and a facemask can affect the impact of arrows. Know your limitations when hunting and get good consistent groups before moving back in distance. You will want to give the game you are pursuing the quickest, cleanest harvest. Lastly, continue to practice throughout the season to stay in shape—make sure nothing loosens up or gets knocked out of timing on your equipment.

While it's very tempting to throw a broadhead out at the range at one of the targets, the targets are not designed to stop these types of points and will either pass completely through or get tangled in the stuffing we use. Should the arrow and broadhead be left in the target, this could result in serious injury to those doing maintenance on the targets.

Although there will probably be fewer and fewer archers at the range on Tuesday evenings through the hunting season, the targets remain in the field. If you have any questions or need help getting dialed in, contact the club, and we will get back to you on upcoming events and indoor winter shooting.

The event was a success through tremendous efforts by team members, coaches, NHF&G officers, and selfless donations!

It was indeed a wonderful experience to watch the friendly banter and amiable exchange between the shooters both on and off the line as the AIM team socialized with some new faces and reconnected with those they had befriended the year prior. There was some angst within the crowd while the scores were compiled—it appeared the officers hadn't been missing a practice. Especially Wayne Saunders—retired Lieutenant and proprietor of Wardens Watch—he had been piling up dust all day. Low and behold, the AIM team managed to pull ahead by the slim margin of 13 birds. We had our Challenge Match with our local Law Enforcement friends, the NH State Police. The Junior Rifle Team did use the Robinson Tryout Match as a fundraising opportunity for the Indoor Range. With 16 participants, we received almost \$3,000 from our generous sponsors. We had a great day on the range with the Troopers and a fun match and exchange of trinkets. We have a nice photo of all the participants on the range.

We were able to compete in the 2021 NRA Junior Sectional matches. We even held one of them. I expect with the new Indoor Range, we will hold a few NRA Sectional Matches in 2022. We hope results will be out later this year although the NRA has had difficulty with a limited staff getting out scores for 2020.

Our Awards Banquet was held on schedule outdoors at the Ferry Brook Range. We do hope to be back in the Marlborough Community House next year. They still had limited capacity in early May.

We were back on track for CMP National Matches. We had 6 of our Juniors participate in the CMP Smallbore Rifle Camp at Camp Perry and another one of our Juniors shot in the Smallbore Rifle National Matches. We pulled our athletes out of

Camp on Team Day during Prone and had 2 Prone Teams entered in the Prone Championships. Members of our Team were at the CMP NM's at Camp Perry from July 19th through the 30th.

This year we had 3 of our athletes qualify for the USA Shooting Junior Olympic Championships. Kyle Huston, Shaylin Cullis and Anna Bittner. Anna and Shaylin were able to participate, but Kyle was unable to attend. The JOSC Championships were held at Hillsdale College in Michigan.


Winter Adult Smallbore 4-Position Cheshire-Windham Rifle League
