

## 11. INDOOR RANGE RULES:

Many of the rules cited in the Indoor Range Rules are duplicates of general rules and procedures already outlined elsewhere in the SOP. It seems prudent to re-emphasize some of these as this set of rules will be printed separately and posted in the Indoor Range with the Indoor Range Checklist.

BE SAFE AND ENJOY YOUR RANGE!!!

1. Authorized Users of the Indoor Range are;
  - a. CCSSEF Foundation Indoor Range Members.
  - b. Group / Training / Competition participants enrolled in scheduled activities.
  - c. Non Indoor Range Members and General Public paying guests during “Public Hours”.  
Non IR Members and Public Guests must show photo identification and sign the Range Use Waiver and Permission Form. RSO’s will photocopy the ID with the signed Form for our records.
  - d. Invited guests of Indoor Range Members follow current SOP guest guidelines.
  - e. Junior participants (under age 18) while under Indoor Range Member or Certified Adult supervision.
2. Indoor Range Hours: The Indoor Range is accessible 24/7/365 by Foundation Indoor range Members that have completed the IR Certification Requirements except during scheduled group or training activities. Indoor Range Members that have not completed the Certification can use the IR during “Open Hours” when an RSO is on duty. Indoor Range Members can use the IR during “Public Hours” on a space available basis. General Public guests will have priority during “Public Hours”. Indoor Range doors are to be kept closed and locked to limit unauthorized entry.
3. Indoor Range Members are required to ‘Log-In’ when they use the IR. Name, any Guest’s names, date & time.
4. Members will display their Membership Identification. RSO’s will enforce membership.
5. Eye and ear protection will be worn in the Indoor Range during firing. Alternative competitive shooter eye protection, such as Gehmann, Knobloch, Champion, Pilla, Zeiss, etc. and rear sight or headgear eye protection and blinders, is acceptable.
6. Any firearms or ammunition is allowed in the Indoor Range except those restricted in the SOP or in the following list. Only commercially available bullets and components will be allowed.
  - a. No full automatic fire. Magazine capacity is limited to the current law.
  - b. No shotgun buckshot or birdshot or BB’s. Slugs are allowed.
  - c. No ‘black powder’ firearms. We may amend this after the ventilation system is tested.
  - d. Rifle calibers up to .50cal.
  - e. No tracer, incendiary, or explosive ammunition.
  - f. No armor piercing, steel/Tungsten/hardened core or any other form of destructive ammunition. RSO’s will review ammunition for compliance.
7. Only paper type targets are allowed on the Indoor Range. Any other type of target requires approval from the Indoor Range Manager (IRM), CRSO or BOD.
  - a. Target size is limited to 24” wide x 36” tall and are to be hung so that all rounds enter the backstop area without striking the floor, ceiling/baffles or walls.
  - b. All shooting is to be done straight in one’s lane with no firing across any lanes.
  - c. The minimum distance for target carriers from the firing line is 20 feet.
  - d. Electronic targets authorized by the IRM, CRSO or BOD may be used.

**WARNING!**

The intentional shooting of target carriers, fixtures, signs, markers, floors, ceilings/baffles or walls is prohibited and cause for immediate dismissal from the range and expulsion of membership.

8. Our range is equipped with electronic target carriers therefore our firing line does not move forward. There will be NO FIRING FORWARD OF THE FIRING LINE. No one is allowed forward of the firing line without permission from a RSO or agreement of all present if no RSO is on the range and all firearms are unloaded, holstered or “benched”. If a target falls from the carrier, bring the carrier back to the line and hang another target. RSO’s will coordinate any necessary cease fire as well as enforcing membership, rules and regulations during scheduled “Open Hours” and “Public Hours”.
9. PRACTICE BASIC SAFETY!!! Muzzle, Action, and Trigger discipline at all times.
  - a. All firearms are to be unloaded holstered, cased or bagged until at the firing line and ready to use.
  - b. Use Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI) or Clear Barrel Indicators (CBI) when ‘benched’ to show the firearm is safe.
10. No one under the influence of drugs or alcohol is allowed in the range.
11. No food in the range.
12. No smoking in the range.
13. Be courteous on the range. No loud conversation while others are shooting. Share the range if more than 7 shooters are there. Maintain good sportsmanship with all Members, Guests and Range Personnel. Maximum of two persons per lane one shooter with one observer or coach.
14. Observe and obey all range rules, posted notices, signs and Range Personnel while on the range.
15. Report all unsafe activities, accidents, incidents and damage observed using the CCSSEF Foundation Incident Reporting Form. These can be placed in the “Drop Box” in the range or Clubhouse.
16. Indoor Range Members must clean up their firing point of trash and brass. Used targets that aren’t being saved must be removed from carriers and properly disposed of. Brass not being kept must be cleaned up and put in labeled containers. Other recyclables such as paper, cardboard or plastics must be put in their proper containers. During RSO managed hours, brass disposal may be done by the RSO at the close of the day.
17. If you are the last Member on the IR you must close up the range per Appendix 8 the Indoor Range Inspection Checklist.
18. If you’re the last person to leave the facility, be sure to check and secure the Clubhouse doors and lock the main gate on your way out.
19. Any exceptions to the Indoor Range Rules requires PRIOR approval from the Indoor Range Manager, Chief Range Safety Officer or Board of Directors.
